Application instructions

Applying to Reed

The purpose of the admission process at Reed College is to determine an applicant's preparation, motivation, and ability to participate successfully in the academic and social community at Reed. Admission decisions are based on academic achievement, verbal and quantitative skills, writing ability, qualities of character, and commitment to learning. We set no arbitrary limit on class rank, grade point average, or standardized tests.

Required tests

All applicants for freshman and transfer admission are required to submit the results of the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT I), or the American College Test (ACT). Three subject tests (SAT II) are strongly recommended, but not required. All students should ask the appropriate testing agency to report the test scores directly to Reed. International students are required to submit scores from the SAT I or the ACT, and are strongly recommended to submit TOEFL or IELTS scores.

Applying as a regular freshman

All regular freshman applicants should submit the Common Application and the Reed application supplement, with the application fee (\$40), no later than January 15. **All remaining items must be received in the admission office before the Admission Committee will begin reviewing the application.** Your high school guidance counselor should submit the school report, as well as the official high school transcript. Teacher evaluations should be completed by teachers in two different academic subject areas. Submit the Reed financial aid form directly to the financial aid office in the envelope provided with this application, and make note of other deadlines in the financial aid section of this cover.

Admission decisions for fall semester will be mailed at the end of March to candidates whose applications are complete and have been reviewed before that date. Those who are admitted will be expected to respond to the offer of admission by the Uniform Candidate's Reply Date, May 1, or two weeks after receipt of a final decision on financial aid. Admission decisions for those who complete their applications after mid-March will be mailed approximately two weeks after receipt of all application materials in the admission office. **Those whose applications have not become complete by March 1 will be at a disadvantage when financial aid awards are made.**

Applying as an early decision candidate

If Reed is your first-choice college and you are certain that you will attend Reed if admitted, then you are invited to apply as an early decision candidate. (There is no early decision option for transfer students, or for students who wish to enter Reed before completing a full four-year high school program.) As an early decision applicant, you may submit regular applications to other schools but, if admitted to Reed, you will be expected to withdraw all applications to other institutions, and you may not initiate any new applications. In addition, you may not apply to more than one institution as an early decision candidate.

The Common Application, the Reed application supplement, and the application fee (\$40) should be submitted by November 15 (Option I) or January 2 (Option II). Please include a cover letter stating your intention to apply early decision. Your high school guidance

counselor should submit the school report, as well as the official high school transcript. Teacher evaluations should be completed by teachers in two different academic subject areas. Submit the Reed financial aid form directly to the financial aid office in the envelope provided with this application, and make note of other deadlines in the financial aid section of this cover. Non-U.S. citizens or non-permanent residents applying for financial aid are only eligible to apply for Early Decision Option I. Please indicate on all application parts and supplements that you are an Early Decision Option 1 or Early Decision Option 2 candidate.

The Admission Committee will either admit, deny, or postpone early decision applications. Postponed applications will be reviewed again with the regular freshman applications in the spring; in such cases, all prior early decision obligations will no longer be applicable. If you are admitted, you will be expected to send the non-refundable enrollment deposit to the admission office by the candidate's reply date noted on the previous page.

Applying as an early admission candidate

The Admission Committee will consider applications from unusually qualified high school students who wish to enter Reed before completing four full years of high school. To be a viable early admission candidate, you should have an outstanding high school record and have exhausted the educational opportunities available to you at your high school. You should follow the application process for regular freshmen, with one exception: your application must be accompanied by a letter from a high school counselor or principal supporting your plan to apply as an early admission candidate. Interviews are highly recommended, and in some cases may be required. Please note that candidates who apply for early admission may not also apply for early decision. Early admission candidates who intend to apply for financial aid should note that federal regulations require that the student receive either a high school diploma, a GED, or state certification in order to be eligible to receive federal financial aid funds.

Applying as a home-schooled candidate

Specific guidelines for home-schooled candidates are available on the web at http://web.reed.edu/apply/applying_to_reed/freshmen_special.html#homeschooled. Home-schooled candidates who intend to apply for financial aid should note that federal regulations require that the student receive either a high school diploma, a GED, or state certification in order to be eligible to receive federal funds.

Applying as a transfer student

You are considered a transfer candidate if you have completed one or more terms (such as a quarter, trimester, or semester) as a full-time student at an institution of higher education, earned a minimum of six Reed units of allowable transfer credit prior to enrollment at Reed, or received financial aid at an accredited institution of higher learning. One Reed unit is equivalent to four semester hours or six quarter hours of credit.

As a transfer applicant, you should submit the Common Application for transfer students, the Reed application supplement, and the application fee (\$40) by March 1. **All remaining items must be received in the admission office before the Admission Committee will begin reviewing the application.** Neither the school report nor

the midyear report is required of transfers. Teacher evaluations must be completed by two academic teachers, at least one of whom must be a college professor. Submit the Reed financial aid form directly to the financial aid office, in the envelope provided with this application, and make note of other deadlines in the financial aid section of these instructions. You must submit complete official transcripts of all high school and college academic work and the College Official's Report (included in this packet). **Those whose applications are not complete by April 1 may be at a disadvantage when financial aid awards are made.**

Applying as an international student

As an international applicant, you should submit the Common Application, the Reed application supplement, and the application fee (\$40 in U.S. funds) by the appropriate deadline. For proper evaluation, the Admission Committee requires full secondary school transcripts (and college or university records, if any), a description of the courses taken, and a statement of grades (or evaluations) for each course. Teacher evaluations must be completed by two teachers in two different academic areas. International students are required to submit scores from the SAT I or the ACT, and TOEFL or IELTS scores are recommended. If you plan to apply for financial aid, submit the following forms directly to the financial aid office in the envelope provided with this application: the Reed financial aid form, the Foreign Student Financial Aid Application (FSFAA), and the Certification of Finances form. Canadian students should submit the CSS Profile. If you are a U.S. Permanent Resident, you must submit a photocopy of your Alien Registration (green card) with your application to Reed. Non-U.S. citizens or non-permanent residents applying for financial aid are only eligible to apply for Early Decision Option I or regular admission.

Reapplying to Reed

Students who applied to Reed previously and who did not subsequently attend the college may reapply for a later semester. The admission office keeps applications on file for two years. Students who reapply will be asked to submit a new application, the reapply supplement (included in this packet), and a \$40 application fee. For other requirements, please see the reapply supplement and reapply checklist in this packet. **Please note that you are allowed to reapply only once.**

The college requires that students who are not initially admitted to Reed complete or be working toward a full year of solid academic coursework elsewhere before reapplying.

A student applying for financial aid should note that reapplying does not guarantee a financial aid award for the semester the student enrolls at Reed. The financial aid application process must be completed annually to determine eligibility for financial aid, and students who reapply must compete with other admitted applicants for available financial aid.

If you plan to apply for financial aid you should submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the College Scholarship Service's (CSS) Profile, and the Reed financial aid form. Please follow the appropriate admission and financial aid application deadlines for regular freshmen or transfers noted in this packet.

Application fee

The application fee is \$40. Payment of the application fee may be made by Visa, Mastercard, Discover or by personal check. We will consider a fee waiver request only in cases where the application fee poses a financial hardship. Requests must be supported by the College Scholarship Service (CSS) waiver request form or by a letter from your guidance counselor indicating financial hardship. To pay online go to the secure website <https://www.applyweb.com/public/register?s=reedadap>. Reed does not participate in the Common Application fee payment site.

Late applications

Under special circumstances, the Admission Committee will consider applications submitted past the deadlines. Students should call the admission office to discuss these requests.

Deferrals

If you are admitted, you may request to defer your enrollment for up to one academic year. If your request for deferral is approved, you must agree not to enroll as a full-time student at another college or university, and you must not apply to other colleges or universities in the deferral year. Deferral requests should be directed to the dean of admission by the appropriate reply date and must be accompanied by the non-refundable enrollment deposit. The deposit will reserve a place in the desired entering class and will be applied toward tuition. If the deferral is not granted, Reed will return your deposit and note procedures for applying again at a later date. **Please write or call the financial aid office if you have applied for assistance and are considering deferral.**


Financial aid

Reed adheres to the policy of awarding financial assistance to students according to financial need, as determined by an analysis of the information you submit on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), the College Scholarship Service's (CSS) Profile, and parent and student IRS income tax returns, including all schedules and W-2 and 1099 statements. CSS Profile registration materials are available online at www.collegeboard.com. The FAFSA is available at most high schools and colleges and online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **International students** must instead submit the Foreign Student Financial Aid Application (FSFAA) and the Certification of Finances form. Canadian students should submit the CSS Profile.

Early admission, home-schooled, and other candidates who do not have a high school diploma should note that a GED is required to be eligible for federal financial assistance. If you have questions, you may reach Reed's financial aid office at 503/777-7223 or 800/547-4750; the email address is financial.aid@reed.edu.

- Submit only one application, either a hard copy or an online copy.
- Keep photocopies of your completed application for your records.
 - Remember to forward all pieces of your application to Reed on or before the appropriate deadline.
 - Your application file must be complete before we can begin reviewing your application.

If you apply using a paper copy of the Common Application . . .

- Submit the **Common Application** and the **Reed application supplement**, with the **application fee** (\$40, payable by check or credit card) by the appropriate deadline. (If paying by credit card, complete the credit card information on the Reed application fee form, or online at <https://www.applyweb.com/public/register?s=reedadap>.) In case of financial hardship, you may submit an official fee waiver form from your college counselor.
- Prepare your admission **essays** (part of the Reed application supplement). Reed requires three writing samples:
 - 1) a personal statement (you can use either the personal statement you wrote for the Common Application or answer any question from another college's application),
 - 2) a "Why Reed?" statement, and
 - 3) a writing sample (a copy of a research, expository or creative paper [in English] with instructor's grade and/or comments).
- Provide your school's college counseling office with the following:
 - 1) the **school report form** with one of the enclosed admission office envelopes,
 - 2) a request for official high school **transcripts** to be mailed directly to Reed, and
 - 3) the **midyear report form**, asking that your final grades for the first semester or trimester of your senior year be submitted to Reed.
- If not recorded on your official transcript, **SAT I** or **ACT** scores must be sent to Reed by the testing company.
- A **teacher evaluation form** and one of the enclosed admission office envelopes should be provided to each of the two teachers who will write your recommendations.
- If you are applying for financial aid, submit the FAFSA and CSS Profile to the appropriate processors by January 15, 2007. You should also submit the **financial aid form** to Reed's financial aid office in the envelope provided in this packet by the appropriate admission application deadline.
- If you are applying for Early Decision Option II, please mark "ED II" on the top of all forms.

If you apply using the online Common Application . . .

- Go to <http://www.commonapp.org>, and follow the instructions for applying to Reed. Be sure to complete all parts of the application; this means submitting your part online and having your counselor and two teachers submit **recommendations**.
- Reed does not participate in the Common Application fee payment site. In order to pay the **application fee**, use your credit card online at <https://www.applyweb.com/public/register?s=reedadap>. Or you can send a check or money order in the amount of \$40 to Reed College Office of Admission, 3203 SE Woodstock Blvd., Portland OR 97202-8199. Indicate in a note with the check that you have submitted your application electronically. Be sure to include your full name on the check. In case of financial hardship, you may submit an official fee waiver form from your college counselor.
- Go to http://web.reed.edu/apply/applying_to_reed/application_forms.html to download a copy of the **Reed application supplement**. Complete the supplement form, including your **essays**, and mail it to Reed.
- Follow the instructions under "paper copy" above for **transcripts**, **test scores**, the **school report form**, the **midyear report form**, and the **financial aid form**.

If you apply as a transfer student . . .

- Submit the **Common Application** and the **Reed application supplement**, with the **application fee** (\$40 payable by check or credit card) by March 1. (If paying by credit card, complete the credit card information on the Reed application supplement, or online at <https://www.applyweb.com/public/register?s=reedadap>.) In case of financial hardship, call or write the admission office. Do not include the **school report** and **midyear report forms**.
- Prepare your admission **essays** (part of the Reed application supplement). Reed requires three writing samples:
 - 1) a personal statement, including a statement of why you are transferring
 - 2) a “Why Reed?” statement, and
 - 3) a writing sample (a copy of a research, expository or creative paper [in English] with instructor’s grade and/or comments).
- For students reapplying, submit a “What I’ve been doing since I last applied” essay.
- Have the dean of your current college (or most recent college if not currently enrolled) prepare the College Official’s Report. Mail it with your application or have the dean mail it directly to Reed.
- Request to have official **transcripts** sent to Reed from your high school and the college(s) you have attended.
- If not recorded on an official transcript, **SAT I** or **ACT** scores must be sent to Reed by the testing company.
- A **teacher evaluation form** and one of the enclosed admission office envelopes should be provided to each of the two professors who will write your recommendations.
- If you are applying for financial aid, submit the FAFSA and CSS Profile to the appropriate processors by March 1, 2007. You should also submit the **financial aid form** to Reed’s financial aid office in the envelope provided in this packet by March 1, 2007.
- It is not necessary, as a transfer applicant, to submit the **secondary school report** nor the **midyear report**.

If you apply as an international student . . .

- Submit the **Common Application** and the **Reed application supplement**, with the **application fee** (\$40, payable by check or credit card) by the appropriate deadline. (If paying by credit card, complete the credit card information on the Reed application supplement, or online at <https://www.applyweb.com/public/register?s=reedadap>.) In case of financial hardship, you may submit an official fee waiver form from your college counselor.
- Prepare your admission **essays** (part of the Reed application supplement). Reed requires two writing samples:
 - 1) a personal statement, and
 - 2) a “Why Reed?” statement.
- For students reapplying, submit a “What I’ve been doing since I last applied” essay.
- Provide your school counselor with the following:
 - 1) the **school report form** with one of the enclosed admission office envelopes,
 - 2) a request for official high school **transcripts** to be mailed directly to Reed, and
 - 3) the **midyear report form**, asking that your final grades for the first semester or trimester of your senior year be submitted to Reed.
- Have your scores from the following tests sent to Reed: **SAT I** or **ACT**, and **TOEFL** or **IELTS**.
- A **teacher evaluation form** and one of the enclosed admission office envelopes should be provided to each of the two teachers who will write your recommendations.
- If you are applying for financial aid, submit the Reed **financial aid form**, the **Foreign Student Financial Aid Application (FSFAA)**, and the **Certification of Finances form** directly to Reed’s financial aid office by the appropriate deadline. Forms are available through Reed’s financial aid office.
- If you are a U.S. Permanent Resident, you must submit to Reed a photocopy of your **Alien Registration** (green card).
- Canadian students should submit the **CSS Profile** to the College Board for processing according to instructions that accompany the form.

If you reapply . . .

(If you applied to Reed previously but did not attend)

Please pay close attention to the instructions that follow, and use the Reed reapply supplement at the back of these pages (in addition to the Common Application). If you have any questions about reapplying, please call the admission office (800/547-4750 or 503/777-7511) and speak to either the transfer coordinator or the application coordinator. *Please note that you may only reapply once.*

Decide whether you are reapplying as a freshman or a transfer.

You must reapply as a transfer student if you:

- 1) have completed one or more terms as a full-time student working toward a degree from a regionally accredited institution of higher learning; or
- 2) have earned a minimum of six Reed units after earning your high school diploma or GED (one Reed unit equals four semester or six quarter credit hours of allowable transfer credit from an institution of higher learning); or
- 3) have received financial aid at an accredited institution of higher learning; or
- 4) were not initially admitted to Reed. If this is the case, you must be working toward a *full year* of solid college coursework before reapplying; you would then reapply as a transfer student.

If you are reapplying as a transfer, we must receive the following new information **by March 1**.

- 1) Common Application and Reed *reapply* supplement (you do **not** need to include the Reed application supplement);
- 2) A \$40 application fee;
- 3) Final high school transcript (showing graduation date) or GED results;
- 4) College transcript(s);
- 5) College Official's Report (from last college attended or attending);
- 6) A new personal statement including a statement of why you are transferring;
- 7) A new "Why Reed?" essay;
- 8) At least one new letter of recommendation from a college professor.

If you are reapplying as a freshman*, we must receive the following new information **by the appropriate deadline ****.

- 1) Common Application and Reed *reapply* supplement (you do **not** need to include the Reed application supplement);
- 2) A \$40 application fee;
- 3) Final high school transcript (showing graduation date) or GED results;
- 4) Transcripts of any coursework subsequent to high school;
- 5) A new personal statement;
- 6) A new "Why Reed?" essay;
- 7) A statement regarding what you've been doing since you last applied
- 8) At least one new letter of recommendation.

* You may reapply as a freshman only if you were admitted to Reed the first time you applied.
